	Mecklenburg county as of today-Monarch.	
	• The original benchmark for agencies to have been certified to become a CABHA was by the end	
	of September to continue; new benchmarks have been established. For providers who are "in	
	process" at the end of September, they do not have to submit a transition plan unless they do not	
	obtain CABHA certification by Nov. 15. All other agencies not in process must submit	
	individualized transition plans where all consumers are transitioned to another appropriate provider no later than December 31, 2010.
