- ⇒ **Elements of a Functional First Responder System** –The Mecklenburg County Consumer and Family Advisory Committee (CFAC) and LME consider the following elements to constitute a Functional First Responder System (FFRS):
  - Providers have a 911 prompt for medical crises on their voicemail systems.
  - Providers have a prompt that provides a phone or pager number for assistance with "urgent" or "crisis" needs that cannot wait until the next business day (this number should connect to a person and not another telephone number or voicemail.)
  - If crisis number contacts a pager, the message explains briefly what the caller will hear and how to respond.
  - If the caller does not reach a live person, the voicemail message gives the caller a wait time of no more than 15 minutes to expect a return call.
  - If the caller does not reach a live person, the call is returned within 15 minutes. All providers of enhanced Medicaid services who are required to serve as First Responders should ensure that these elements are included in your First Responder System. The LME and representatives from CFAC will periodically test providers through mock calls to ensure compliance with these requirements.

- ⇒ IPRS Community Support Update Implementation Update #65 recently announced that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services approved a request from DMH/DD/SAS to continue the case management component of Community Support service by qualified and licensed professionals until the new case management service definition is approved. This announcement specifically related to Medicaid recipients. However, LMEs have the option of doing the same under the provisions of their benefit plans. Mecklenburg County Area Mental Health has decided to allow the case management component of the services for IPRS consumers *subject to availability of state funding*. #### Area's Top Mental Health Advocates Working Together

Charlotte, NC (January 5, 2010) – MHA, in partnership with Mecklenburg's Promise, NAMI, DBSA, and Innervision Recovery Center, have come together to provide recovery-focused education to mental health consumers. With some financial support from Janssen Pharmaceutica, MHA and its partners will host quarterly seminars throughout 2010. These workshops will be free of charge for consumers to attend. The goal of this partnership is to promote mental wellness, reduce the stigma associated with mental illnesses, empower consumers, and encourage self-advocacy.

MHA's 77-year history of mental health advocacy within the local community is deeply rooted. "We have wanted to work together [with the other agencies] but until now haven't been able to make that possible", states Ellis C. Fields, MHA Executive Director. The agency's collaboration with other local advocacy organizations was fueled by a new partnership with Janssen Pharmaceutica.

Janssen developed a new tool to help individuals without an occurring mental illness understand some of the key symptoms of schizophrenia, one of the more pervasive mental illnesses. "Mind Storm" is a simulation tool, designed to allow anyone to experience the hallmark symptoms of schizophrenia, such as hallucinations and delusions. Janssen brought this simulation to a recent policy event so that MHA constituents could experience it. Some commented that Mind Storm helped them better understand the difficulties in managing a major mental illness.

Janssen will provide the keynote speaker for the first workshop "Choices in Recovery" to be held on Friday, January 22 from 10 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. (click here to see brochure). Kathleen S. Jarboe will be the keynote and is an advanced practice registered nurse specializing in psychiatry. She is a Clinical Team Leader for Quintiles Transnational, Inc., the largest Clinical Research Organization in the World. Prior to joining Quintiles, Inc., Ms. Jarboe practiced at Emory University School of Medicine for 16 years in nursing as a Head Nurse and Clinical Research Nurse Manager of the Schizophrenia and Bipolar Clinical Trials Program.

Mecklenburg's Promise will provide additional training and education on crisis management and developing natural supports. DBSA, Depression-Bipoloar Support Alliance, will be on hand to discuss their mission and activities. NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) will also provide materials related to their family-to-family training. Many other community partners will participate in the day and a hot lunch will be provided.
