PROVIDER HOT SHEET

⇒ Please note: the November 3rd InfoShare is cancelled. During these challenging and ever-changing times, we believe it is important as a community to pause, reflect and re-evaluate opportunities for improvement.

InfoShare has been one method of communication between the LME and the community of providers; incorporating a variety of meeting and discussion formats in these regular quarterly sessions.

We need your input. Has the InfoShare format been an effective way to gather and share information? Are the agendas, topics, and discussions relevant and useful to providers? Are there specific ways we can better use this time together?

We want your feedback, suggestions and ideas about how to improve communication and collaboration between the LME, providers, consumers and family members. LME staff will be meeting with the Provider Council's Executive Board and with the Mecklenburg Consumer and Family Advisory Committee to create a special agenda for the January 2011 InfoShare. In the meantime, we ask that you begin considering ways to enhance or improve the InfoShare structure for 2011.

⇒ New CAP MR/DD policies contained in Implementation Update #76 will be effective February 1, 2011 unless otherwise noted. Participants, guardians and legally responsible persons will have this time to determine alternate support options to ensure the health and safety needs are adequately addressed. In the event a participant cannot make the transition to the policy changes by the February 1, 2011 effective date, DMH/DD/SAS will review the participant's PCP and determine if further time is needed or if other actions are necessary for the participant to safely make the transition.

The process to request an exception or extension for individuals who are unable to make the needed changes as required by February 1, 2011 is as follows:

By December 1, 2010 the case manager must send the LME the request for an extension or exception using the CAP-MR/DD Policy Requirements Extension/Exception Request Form. The request shall contain the revised PCP with any documentation and justification as to the specific health and safety issues and reasons why the individual cannot meet the transition requirements. The form is located at http://www.ncdhhs.gov/mhddsas/cap-mrdd/index.htm

- LME staff will review the request for an extension or exception, including the revised PCP and discuss with the case manager the specific health and safety issues preventing transition as required by February 1, 2011 and possible alternatives to address the individual's support needs.
- By January 1, 2011 the LME shall send the completed CAP-MR/DD Policy Requirements
 Extension/Exception Request Form and PCP with accompanying documentation/justification to
 DMH/DD/SAS and request an extension or exception to the required transition.
- DMH/DD/SAS will review the completed CAP-MR/DD Policy Requirements Extension and Exception Request Form, the PCP and accompanying documentation/justification and discuss with the LME and case manager if appropriate.
- If DMH/DD/SAS determines the individual has health and safety risks that may be affected by the required transition an extension or exception may be granted.
- An extension or exception may be granted **ONLY** if the services are necessary to assure the health and safety of the participant.
 - If services are requested to assure the health and safety of the participant, the PCP must clearly describe:

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- how the health and safety of the participant is at risk without these services, AND
- measures taken to use natural and other community supports to assure the health and safety
 of the individual, AND demonstrate that no other options are available to assure health and
 safety of the participant other than providing services that will exceed the UR guidelines.
- Within 15 days from receipt DMH/DD/SAS staff will provide a written response to the LME indicating the decision for the extension or exception request.
- If the DMH/DD/SAS approves the request, notification will be provided to the LME who will in turn notify the case manager.
- If the DMH/DD/SAS determines an extension or exception is not justified and denies the request, the DMH/DD/SAS will notify the participant and guardian (copying the LME). The LME will notify the case manager.
- Participants whose request for an exception or extension are denied will have due process rights for appeals of those decisions.

⇒ Billing Compliance Reviews

The LME conducts compliance reviews of Medicaid and non-Medicaid funded services:

- To ensure services delivered are appropriate and are provided in accordance with the NC Administrative Code; the DMH/DD/SAS and Medicaid Services Definitions Manual; DHHS policies and communications; the Medicaid Provider Enrollment Agreement; the North Carolina General Statues and the Federal Code of Regulations;
 - and,
- 2) To prevent and detect violations of Medicaid, State, Federal, and County billing requirements.

The Billing Compliance Review Tool Procedure as well as the Billing Compliance Review Tool will be posted on the AMH Website for review.

- ⇒ Mecklenburg County Community Collaborative Care Review Teams When the LME began the Level III and IV Residential Transition project for children in the fall of 2009, 147 consumers were in these levels of care. At present, there are 21 consumers in level III residential group homes and no consumers in level IV. As a direct result of this significant decrease, there is no longer a need for four Care Review Teams per month to specifically address reauthorization requests for residential placements. Effective January 1st, there will only be 2 Care Review Teams convened each month for reauthorization requests; occurring on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month from 1-4pm. Please refer to the attached Care Review Team factsheet which stipulates scheduling and protocol for all Care Review Team sessions.
- ⇒ IRIS Training for New Users is available for those who have not attended any previous IRIS training. Please choose from one of these 2-hour sessions Nov 9th or Dec 7th from 9:00-11:00 AM.

⇒ Elements of a Functional First Responder System

The Mecklenburg County Consumer and Family Advisory Committee (CFAC) and LME consider the following elements to constitute a Functional First Responder System (FFRS):

- The provider has a 911 prompt for medical crisis on their voicemail system.
- The provider has a prompt that provides a phone or pager number for assistance with "urgent" or "crisis" needs that cannot wait until the next business day (this number should connect to a person and not another telephone number or voicemail.)
- If crisis number contacts a pager, the message explains briefly what the caller will hear and

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how to respond.

- If the caller does not reach a live person, the voicemail message gives the caller a wait time of no more than 15 minutes to expect a return call.
- If the caller does not reach a live person, the call is returned within 15 minutes.

All providers of enhanced Medicaid services that are required to serve as First Responders should ensure that these elements are included in your First Responder System. The LME and representatives from CFAC will periodically test providers through Mock Calls to ensure compliance with these requirements.



WHAT

Mecklenburg County's Care Review Teams (CRTs) are a cross-organizational mix of parents and professionals who assist child and family teams achieve the outcomes they are working toward. They act in a consultative and collaborative manner, promoting System of Care principles:

- Family-driven
- Youth-guided
- Culturally and linguistically competent
- Strong reliance on community supports systems
- Collaboration across agencies
- Home, community, and schoolbased
- Individualized strength-based care
- Data-driven for continuous improvement
- improvementHolding ourselves and each other accountable

At the end of the meeting, your team will walk out with an action plan.

FOR WHOM

The CRTs are open to child and family teams working with children with severe emotional disturbances. The Community Collaborative strongly encourages child and family teams to come to Care Review before they have exhausted all resources.

The CRTs are held at the Watkins Center, 3500 Ellington Drive, Charlotte, NC 28211

WHEN

Team A – 2nd Friday of each month (1 hour slots) 1:00pm, 2:00pm, and 3:00pm

Team B – 4th Friday of each month (1 hour slots) 1:00pm, 2:00pm, and 3:00pm

Team C – Level III/IV Residential Reauthorizations Requests - 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month (30 minute slots) 1:00pm, 1:30p, 2:00pm, 2:30pm, 3:00pm, and 3:30pm

HOW

WHY

- To obtain the SOC Coordinator/Representative or designee's signature on discharge plans for reauthorizations of residential level III/IV services.
- o To get a fresh perspective, especially when:
 - o a young person is at risk of an out-of-home placement
 - the team needs help making progress toward its goals
 - the team would like help sorting through disagreements and building consensus among team members
 - the team would like to be coached about options before an issue of custody is brought before a judge
- o For review of all requests for out-of-state placement




