⇒ 2011 LME Consumer Satisfaction Survey

In the past, the LME has asked providers to administer a Consumer Satisfaction Survey on the State's behalf. To date, the State has not scheduled a survey for this fiscal year. An annual survey is required for accreditation and by Mecklenburg County. Therefore, the LME has taken the initiative to develop a basic and brief survey (16 questions) that includes key customer satisfaction concepts established by Mecklenburg County (ethics, communication, quality, timeliness, and courtesy and respect), basic concerns from the previous surveys (making complaints, choice of providers, discussion of progress and goals) in addition to some bottom line "hotel" type concepts (cleanliness, location, keeping appointments). The demographic information at the top of the survey has been expanded to provide more data items for evaluating and improving consumer satisfaction (education, age, culture, etc.). The LME expects that this survey will be further developed in the next year to include recovery and self-determination concepts.

The survey will be conducted May 15 – June 10, 2011.

The survey should be administered to all Mecklenburg consumers served during the survey period, which include:

- Consumers whose services have been authorized by the LME. The list of consumers authorized by the LME and a survey for each is enclosed in your packet.
- Consumers with Medicaid only who receive services from you during the survey period. The LME does not have a list of direct billed Medicaid consumers. One survey is included in your packet that you can copy for these consumers.

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• Consumers who speak Spanish. One Spanish survey is included in your packet that you can copy for these consumers.

The LME has mailed surveys (English and Spanish version) and instructions to all providers on the current LME provider list. The number of surveys sent was determined by reports from eCura, the LME data management system. The survey packets include:

- For Providers in eCura:
 - Survey Instructions.
 - o A list of consumers authorized by the LME to receive services, with their consumer ID numbers.
 - A survey in English for each consumer authorized to receive services during the survey period.
 - A survey in Spanish to be copied as needed.
- For Providers who only bill Medicaid directly:
 - o Survey Instructions.
 - A survey in English to be copied as needed for each consumer receiving services during the survey period.
 - A survey in Spanish to be copied as needed.

The surveys are also on the LME Public webpage in the Provider Resource Library under the Forms Category for download if needed.

SUBJECT: DHHS Records Retention and Disposition Schedule for Grants

Semiannually, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services Controller's Office issues the DHHS Records Retention and Disposition Schedule for Grants, which provides **by funding source and State fiscal year** the earliest date that records for the funding source may be destroyed. This retention schedule is governed by Federal regulations found at 7 CFR 3016.42, 7 CFR 3019.53, 45 CFR 74.53 and 45 CFR 92.42 and State regulations found at 09 NCAC 03M .0703 (4). All financial and programmatic records, supporting documents, statistical records, and all other records pertinent to a Federal award must be retained in accordance with this schedule. All State and local government agencies, nongovernmental entities and their subrecipients, including applicable vendors, that administer programs funded by Federal sources passed through the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services and its divisions and offices ("DHHS") are expected to maintain compliance with both the DHHS Records Retention and Disposition Schedule for Grants and any agency-specific programmatic record retention requirements.

The DHHS Records Retention and Disposition Schedule for Grants has been updated through March 31, 2011, and supersedes previously approved applicable schedules. Grant records with a purge date (i.e. any date appearing in column three of the schedule) more than two years prior to the Schedule's posting date have been removed. Additionally, the updated Schedule includes adjustments to purge dates for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) grants. The records retention period for the TANF program, also known as the Work First program, changed DHHS Records Retention and Disposition Schedule for Grants May 20, 2011 Page 2

from five years to a retention period of ten years. The Work First program automatically provides Medical Assistance benefits to recipients of Work First. Recipients of Work First benefits are tied to eligibility for the DHHS/Division of Medical Assistance programs, which require a ten year retention period. As a result, the Work First program should adhere to the more restrictive retention period. All financial and programmatic records as well as all supporting documentation for the Work First program must be retained for a period of ten years.

Please notify all employees and all contractors who are or will be involved in the records retention and disposition process that the updated Memorandum and Schedule have been posted along with the related Background pages.
