⇒ <u>Please Note</u>: Plan to attend a special **Provider Infoshare** meeting to be held on **Wednesday, March 7**, **2012** from 9:00 until 11:30 at Covenant Presbyterian Church, Fellowship Hall, 1000 E. Morehead Street, Charlotte.

The agenda will be a presentation from Patrick Piggott, Chief, Behavioral Health Review Section, Program Integrity Unit, North Carolina Division of Medical Assistance (DMA). Mr. Piggott's presentation will include issues around Provider Fraud and Abuse, the False Claims Act, New Federal Rules: Credible Allegations of Fraud and Suspension of Medicaid Payments, and Provider Screening and Enrollment under a Medicaid waiver environment. This will be an interactive session; providers will have an opportunity to ask Mr. Piggott questions during the presentation.

This particular InfoShare is targeting agency Chief Executive Officers and Chief Operations Officers as the audience for Mr. Piggott's presentation. The LME strongly encourages each agency to send the appropriate agency representative to this session.

Topics include: Covered Benefit Package, Authorization of Services, Targeted Case Management and Care Coordination, and enrollment in LME-MCO Medicaid Provider Networks. Please note: Provider enrollment in Mecklenburg's provider network will begin mid to late June; enrollment information will be posted on AMH's website and in future hotsheets.

⇒ Request for Proposal: Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR)- Mecklenburg County Area Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services (AMH) is requesting proposals from qualified, experienced and endorsed providers of Psychosocial Rehabilitation services.

This Request for Proposals (RFP) is part of the LME's contract "re-bidding" process which means that any agency currently receiving state IPRS funds through a contract with the LME for Psychosocial Rehabilitation services must submit an RFP and be evaluated through this process in order to be considered for continuation and future funding for this service.

Over the past two fiscal years the utilization rate of individuals receiving State funded IPRS Psychosocial Rehabilitation services during a twelve month period has been an average of 45 individuals. The total paid claims reimbursement amount for the provision of Psychosocial Rehabilitation services for this number of individuals over a twelve month period has been in the range of \$110,000 - \$130,000.

AMH is seeking to select and develop IPRS state funded contracts with up to two (2) providers of Psychosocial Rehabilitation services for the period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. The initial contract award for each provider may be in the range of \$55,000 - \$65,000 based on the availability of State funds allocated to AMH for FY'13. This will be a fee for service contract, therefore utilization will be monitored on a quarterly basis and funds may be reallocated based on consumer choice, clinical quality of care concerns, utilization trends and paid claims data.

CONSUMER AND FAMILY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

⇒ **The Star Rating** – The star rating review team composed of three CFAC members, four provider representatives and three LME staff completed revisions of the Star Rating consumer tool. Special thanks to that team for their dedication to this task.

Provider feedback from previous requests and from the Provider Council meeting after the January InfoShare was incorporated into discussion about revisions. CFAC and the Provider Council Executive Board reviewed the revised standards and provided additional feedback. Five providers volunteered to be rated as a pilot of the revised standards. Those agencies will be rated by March 19 when the review team will meet again to discuss those results and make final decisions about the revised standards.

The revised Star Rating tool will be published in the Hot Sheet as soon as it is finalized in March. Training on the revised tool will be scheduled for early April; then ratings will begin. The first round of ratings will be completed for all state funded clinical home providers by late May. For consistency, one reviewer will perform all these reviews. - ⇒ Waiver Communication Plan: CFAC continues to work with the LME, Mecklenburg County's Public Service and Information specialist and Mecklenburg advocacy organizations to develop a waiver communication plan for consumers and other stakeholders. CFAC members have visited other LME communication meetings and reviewed other LME communication documents. CFAC will work with the Provider Council Executive Board and provider community to develop a consistent, population specific message about the waiver for consumers and the community.
