The presentation will focus on Provider Network Operations to include: Network Analysis, Provider Selection, Enrollment and Credentialing and Provider Monitoring.

This will be an interactive session; providers will have an opportunity to ask questions during the presentation. This InfoShare is targeting agency Chief Executive Officers and Chief Operations Officers as the audience for DMA's presentation. The LME strongly encourages each agency to send the appropriate agency representative to this session.

- $\Rightarrow$  Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has approved the extension of the Comprehensive and Supports CAP-I/DD waivers though June 28, 2012.

The positions currently posted are: AMH Manager: Quality Improvement and AMH Manager: Provider Network Director. The Medicaid Waiver will go live in Mecklenburg on January 1, 2013.
- ⇒ A Special Implementation Update #95 regarding the 1915 b/c Medicaid Waiver Expansion has been posted to the Division MH/DD/SA Services' web site.
- ⇒ Services to Deaf and Hard of Hearing Consumers Please be reminded that providers who receive public funding are required to provide sign language accessibility to consumers in their services. In addition, providers are responsible for covering the cost of interpreting services beyond the payable amount from the state interpreting fund.
