The agenda will be a presentation from Dr. Aalece Pugh-Lilly, LME Division Director for Care Coordination. The presentation will focus on the proposed plan for MH/SA Care Coordination including the TCM transition process. This will be an interactive session and providers will have an opportunity to ask questions and provide input and feedback to the proposed plan. This InfoShare is targeting agency Clinical Directors, Program Managers and Supervisors as the audience for Dr. Pugh-Lilly's presentation. The LME strongly encourages each agency to send the appropriate agency representative(s) to this session.

⇒ LME On the Move:

- Martha Joslin, LPC has been the Deputy Director of Service Management for the past 5 years. As of May 18, 2012 Martha is retiring from Mecklenburg County. Martha brought great skill and compassion to the Utilization Management, Call Center and Intensive Care Management Divisions of the LME. Please join us in wishing her well.
- Paige Walther, LPC has been promoted to Senior AMH Manager, Utilization Management. Paige now
 oversees Utilization Management functions for Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities, Mental Health
 and Substance Abuse. This area is pivotal to the success of the existing LME business and the
 developing Medicaid Managed Care Operation. Prior to this promotion, Ms. Walther was supervisor of
 UM for Mental Health and Substance Abuse services.
- Aalece Pugh-Lilly, PhD has accepted the position of Division Director for Care Coordination. Care
 Coordination Division will include the existing Intensive Care Management (ICM) and will expand to
 incorporate the Care Coordination function for Innovations participants and individuals with special
 needs in the mental health and substance abuse continuum. Dr. Pugh-Lilly has served as clinical
 supervisor for MeckLINK call center and was instrumental in developing our ICM program.
- Linda Margerum, LCSW has been promoted to QI Supervisor. She will directly supervise the quality and data analysts, and the consumer representative. Prior to this assignment Linda worked as quality analyst in the areas of credentialing, appeals, and clinical risk.
- ⇒ North Carolina 2012 Perception of Care Survey The LME has received the Perception of Care Survey from the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services. The Division has instructed that the survey be sent to all Providers who serve active Mental Health and Substance Abuse consumers. These are for consumers who are to receive a service (including an admission) from May 14 May 27, 2012.

There are three different forms (in English and Spanish) that may be used to assess the consumer's opinion of services received.

- The Adult Form for age 18 and up
- The Youth Services Survey (YSS) form for age 12 through 17
- The Youth Services Survey for Families (YSS-F) for age 11 and under

- ⇒ **Diagnosis Codes on IPRS Claims** -When submitting an IPRS claim for payment, a valid Diagnosis Code relating to the service provided to the consumer must be on the claim. IPRS Claims will be rejected if a valid diagnosis code or if no diagnosis is submitted on the claim. The LME cannot process claims in our software system to the various funding sources without this information.
- ⇒ Critical Access Behavioral Health Agency First Responder Requirements This is a reminder to all CABHA agencies regarding First Responder Requirements for consumers served in the agency as outlined in Implementation Update #86. Specifically:
 - "Critical Access Behavioral Health Agencies shall perform "first responder" crisis response 24 hours a
 day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year to all consumers accessing Critical Access Behavioral Health
 Agency services".
 - All Critical Access Behavioral Health Agencies shall be accessible 24/7/365 to respond <u>directly to consumers</u> and to collaborate with and provide guidance to other crisis responders regarding coordination of treatment for Critical Access Behavioral Health Agency consumers in crisis.
 - Each Critical Access Behavioral Health Agency shall provide <u>all consumers with a phone number to contact a live person 24/7/365</u> for use when crises occur.
