PROVIDER HOT SHEET

- Request for Services: As a reminder to providers, all requests for services including any request for services for High Risk consumers should be forwarded to Utilization Management for review. A complete request includes an authorization request along with a Person Center Plan that identifies appropriate short term goals, long term goals and that includes relevant clinical information that supports medical necessity. Requests will be reviewed within 14 calendar days unless there is a requirement to expedite the request. Expedited requests are reviewed within 3 calendar days. If the Person Centered Team requires assistance with planning, coordination of care or identifying appropriate services, please call 704-336-6404 and the team can be connected to care coordination for assistance.
- ⇒ Extension of Submission Date for the <u>Agency Application Process</u> for participation in the 1915(b)(c) waivers through MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare: Due to September 30, 2012 falling on a Sunday, MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare has extended the deadline for acceptance of Agency Applications to be included in the Standard Review process. Provider Applications received prior to 12:00 PM, October 1, 2012 will be part of the Standard Review process. Provider Applications received after 12:00 PM, October 1, 2012 will be processed in the order they are received. MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare expects a large volume of provider applications and cannot guarantee applications received after 12:00 PM, October 1, 2012 will be processed prior to January 1, 2013.

- Dicensed Independent Practitioner (LIP), Group Practice, and Hospital & Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Applications and Processes for participation in the 1915(b)(c) waivers through MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare: MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare is working with the Credentials Verification Organization (CVO), Medversant, to finalize the "Web Portal" for the LIP, Group Practice, and Hospital & Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Applications. The "Web Portal" should be available by September 14, 2012. All forms and instructions for submitting a LIP, Group Practice, and Hospital & Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Application will be available through the "Web Portal". The deadline for LIPs, Group Practices, and Hospitals & Inpatient Psychiatric Facilities to submit their applications will be 12:00 PM, November 16, 2012. LIP, Group Practice, and Hospital & Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Applications submitted after 12:00 PM, November 16, 2012 will be addressed on a case-by-case basis and will not be guaranteed a contract with MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare.
- ⇒ Incident Reporting Reminder: All providers need to make sure you have resubmitted incident reports in IRIS as requested by the LME. Currently there are many reports that are out of compliance with 10A NCAC 27G .0600 because reports requiring corrections or updates have not been resubmitted. If you have submitted any incident reports since June, 2012 please check to make sure they are closed. If they are not you will need to look in the report for communication from the LME as to what was requested, complete the report, and resubmit it, or call Nancy Cody at 704-336-6027.
- ⇒ Provider Performance Report Update MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare has completed the initial phase of Provider Performance Report(PPR) reviews for IPRS contracted providers. The findings of the reviews will be presented at the September 2012 Consumer and Family Advisory Committee as well as the

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Provider Council Executive Board meeting. Final results will be sent out to providers and posted on the MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare website the first week in October.

CLINICAL CORNER

- ⇒ The Administration for Children and Families (ACF), in collaboration across many agencies including SAMHSA, has created a Youth Guide on Psychotropic Medications.
 - ➤ This new guide written specifically for youth in foster care with input from youth and professionals looks at ways to handle powerful feelings and behaviors, and make healthy choices. Understanding how psychotropic medication can help and what other options are available can be challenging. *Making Healthy Choices* includes useful information for youth, including questions to ask, worksheets, and tips on:
 - o Recognizing when help is needed
 - Knowing about rights regarding health and who can help make decisions
 - o Considering options, including helpful approaches other than medication
 - Making decisions about how best to stay healthy
 - Maintaining treatment (taking medication safely and continuing or stopping treatment after leaving foster care)
