Last evening, Assistant County Manager, Michelle Lancaster presented terms of the transition and delegated credentialing agreements to the Mecklenburg Board of County Commissioners. ➤ **Top 5 Claims Denial Reasons for January 22-28, 2014**

Reason Code	Denial Reason Description
4	<p>Basic Units: The total number of basic units has been exceeded. For certain services, usually Evaluations and Outpatient Therapy. Adults get 8 units covered without an authorization and children get 16. Basic units are renewed at the beginning of every fiscal year. They follow the patient across providers.</p> <p>RECOMMENDED ACTION: Providers will need to enter a SAR for the service they are trying to get approved. Please contact the call center at 704-336-6404 for assistance.</p>
31	<p>Monthly Limit Exceeded: The amount of units on the claim along with the units on other claims for the same patient and service during the same month exceed what is allowed by the MCO.</p> <p>RECOMMENDED ACTION: Units for monthly service exceeded. Do not re-file claim.</p>
3	<p>AUTHED UNITS EXCEEDED: The service on the claim was authorized. However the provider has gone over the amount of units on the authorization.</p> <p>RECOMMENDED ACTION: Verify units authorized and provided. The provider will need to enter a new SAR for the service. Contact MCO if possible. Do not re-file if authorized units are truly exceeded.</p>
5	<p>CLAIM RECEIVED AFTER BILLABLE DATE: A Provider’s contract specifies a certain number of allowable days to bill for a claim after the date of service. The Provider did not submit the claim on time.</p> <p>RECOMMENDED ACTION: Write-off charges as non-billable. Do not re-bill.</p>

PREVIOUS TOPICS

- **MeckLINK Transition**

North Carolina's Division of Medical Assistance (DMA) and Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services (DMH) officially placed MeckLINK Behavioral Healthcare under a transition plan. DMA and DMH will be monitoring this transition on a weekly basis. DMA & DMH's will monitor MeckLINK's provider network and the "turnover rate," meaning MeckLINK's ability to maintain current capacity.

As of January 28, 2014, MeckLINK will **not** be adding new providers, new services, or new practitioners. In addition MeckLINK will **no** longer accept requests to add additional sites to provider contracts, approve sites moving within a provider agency or between provider agencies, provide a letter of support to add additional residential services, or enter into single case agreements with providers not currently in the MeckLINK provider network.

- **Service Authorization Requests**

MeckLINK Service Management will continue to review and process Service Authorization Requests based on the MeckLINK benefits plan, medical necessity guidelines and service definition requirements through March 31, 2014. - **Credentialing Applications**

As of January 22, 2014 MeckLINK will no longer accept new applications for credentialing. Specifically, MeckLINK will no longer accept applications for new provider agencies, existing provider agencies, new licensed practitioners, and existing licensed practitioners. If you have questions regarding the status of your credentialing application, please contact one of our Credentialing Specialists at (704) 432-0146.

- **On Line – Provider Directory**

Together with the Mecklenburg County IT Department, several MeckLINK teams have been hard at work to complete the on-line provider directory. This new website addition will go live to the public by **Monday, February 17th**. This directory will allow providers, families and consumers to search the provider network based on different criteria. This system works with the ALPHA database to pull up-to-date addresses, phone numbers and provided services.

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➤ **Unmanaged Visits**

Unmanaged Outpatient visits for Basic State and Medicaid Outpatient Services became effective January 1, 2014. Unmanaged visits do not require SARs for the first 8 adult outpatient therapy services or the first 16 child or adolescent outpatient therapy visits.

Under MeckLINK State and Medicaid Plans the following are counted separately above and beyond the first 8 adult or 16 child visits:

Assessments = up to 2 unmanaged units per year

Psychological Evaluations = up to 5 unmanaged units per year

Physicians Visits = up to 144 unmanaged units per year
