7. I-485 South ACTION REQUESTED: FYI

BACKGROUND:

- In June 2012, the MPO requested that NCDOT do the following in regard to the proposed widening of I-485 from I-77 to Rea Road (TIP project R-4902):
 - 1. Amend the typical section for TIP project R-4902 between I-77 and Johnston Road to construct four additional feet of full depth paved shoulder on the median side of the travel lanes in each direction.
 - 2. This portion of roadway should be restriped and used in a later project to separate the general purpose lanes from managed lanes.
 - 3. The decision to implement managed lanes, the selection of type of managed lane, and the operational plan for those lanes will be based on a study of I-485 between I-77 and US 74.
- Planning and environmental studies are now underway for TIP project I-5507 which will add one express lane in each direction on I-485 between I-77 and US 74. This project will use the unused portion of the roadway noted in item #2 above.
- The presentation will focus on recent suggestions that the additional I-485 paving be used as travel lanes in advance of the completion of the I-5507 project.

8. Draft Bonus Allocation & STP-DA Project List

1. Call to Order

MPO Chairwoman Sarah McAulay called the January 2015 CRTPO meeting to order at 6:04 PM.

2. Election of Officers

Chairwoman McAulay opened the floor to nominations for MPO chair and vice-chair for 2015. Vi Lyles nominated Chairwoman McAulay and Vice-Chairman Horvath for chair and vice-chair respectively. Dottie Nash seconded the nominations. Chairwoman McAulay asked for additional nominations; no other nominations were made. Mayor Taylor made a motion to close the floor to nominations. Woody Washam seconded the motion which when put to a vote, passed unanimously.

Chairwoman McAulay then asked for a vote on the 2015 chair and vice-chair nominations. Upon being put to a vote, the nominations of Chairwoman McAulay and Vice-Chairman Horvath were approved unanimously. Ms. Lyles thanked Chairwoman McAulay and Vice-Chairman Horvath for their service to the MPO.

3. Adoption of the Agenda

Chairwoman McAulay asked if there were items to be added to the agenda or changed. No additions or changes were suggested.

Mayor Richardson made a motion to approve the miscellaneous TIP amendments as presented. Mr. Washam seconded the motion. Upon being put to a vote, the motion passed unanimously.

8. Draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Review

Presenter:

Neil Burke

Summary:

Mr. Burke provided information to the MPO via a Power Point presentation, the contents of which are incorporated into the minutes. The presentation covered the following topics: 1) TIP years of commitment and adoption procedure; 2) a review of projects in the draft TIP; 3) a review of the TIP approval schedule.

The years of commitment topic related to a recommendation from NCDOT's P4.0 Work Group that would result in projects with right-of-way (ROW) and/or construction commitments between 2016-2020 being committed for funding and not subject to reprioritization. By contrast, projects with ROW and/or construction after 2021would be subject to reprioritization. Regarding adoption procedures, the NC Board of Transportation will adopt a five-year State TIP (2016-2020) as well as a five-year Developmental Program (2021-2025). MPOs will likely be required to do the same. In the past, MPOs adopted a seven-year TIP.

The presentation then moved into a review of projects proposed for funding. The projects were broken down by STI tier. For the Regional Impact and Division Needs, projects were also broken down by NCDOT division. Tier funding summaries were provided. Regarding the adoption schedule, Mr. Burke stated that the all NC MPOs are expected to adopt their TIPs by August 2015. However, to remain on schedule, the MPO will need to make project list decisions by March. This is because of the amount of time needed for the air quality conformity process.

Barbara Harrison asked about project U-3467A&B (Rea Road Extension) and which sections were funded. She indicated there was a conflict between printed and on-line material. Mr. Burke stated he would look into the matter and contact Ms. Harrison after the meeting. Michael Johnson asked if STP-DA funds could be spent in Iredell County. Mr. Burke replied that they could be spent anywhere in the CRTPO planning area.

9. Bonus Allocation & STP-DA Programming Process

Presenter:

Bill Coxe, Town of Huntersville

Summary:

Mr. Coxe provided information to the MPO via a Power Point presentation, the contents of which are incorporated into the minutes. The presentation provided details about the STP-DA program and the Bonus Allocation (BA) funding source. The TCC's efforts to prepare STP-DA and BA projects lists for the MPO's consideration were reviewed. It was noted that 75 projects costing approximately \$1 billion were submitted as BA candidate projects, but that only \$158 million of BA funds was expected to be available. One of the next steps in the process will be to present a draft project list to the MPO at its February meeting.

Mayor Taylor asked if BA funds allocation procedures are unchangeable. Mr. Coxe replied that some procedures are found in state statute and therefore not flexible, but that others are a matter of state policy.

10. MPO Planning Area Expansion

Presenter:

Andrew Ventresca, Iredell County

Summary:

Mr. Ventresca provided information to the MPO via a Power Point presentation, the contents of which are incorporated into the minutes. He stated that the northern portion of Iredell County (north of the South Yadkin River) is currently part of the Unifour RPO. NCDOT has allowed the Greater Hickory MPO to incorporate the Unifour RPO to streamline its transportation functions. The Hickory MPO has invited the northern portion of Iredell County to join its planning area, however, Iredell County staff prefers to have the entire county within CRTPO for the following reasons: 1) staff/elected officials will no longer be split between two planning organizations; 2) there is an established working relationship with CRTPO; 3) NC DOT Division 12 has no other jurisdiction in either of the two adjacent RPOs (it would be possible for northern Iredell County to become a member of one of the two RPOs); 4) the county commissioners unanimously endorsed staff's preference on January 6th. Mr. Ventresca added that there are two municipalities in the northern portion of Iredell County, however, Love Valley does not have a land use plan making it ineligible to become a member jurisdiction, and the Town of Harmony has no desire to become a member jurisdiction.

Mayor Taylor asked if there were potential unintended consequences. Mr. Cook responded that there have been several discussions with NCDOT and Federal Highway Administration staff, and that both felt the expansion could occur without major problems, but he emphasized that the discussions would continue to identify potential problems before an expansion is finalized. None of the MPO members present expressed significant concerns about the possible expansion.

11. FY 2016 Unified Planning Work Program

Presenter:

Robert Cook

Summary:

Mr. Cook provided information to the MPO via a Power Point presentation, the contents of which are incorporated into the minutes. The presentation reviewed UPWP essentials and noted the MPO's three funding sources. The funding amounts were shown as the following:

Planning (PL) funds \$833,295 STP-DA \$800,000 Section 5303 \$445,760 Total \$2,079,055.

The PL amount is tentative; the final amount is expected to be available by March 2014.

Local transportation planning projects were reviewed. Nine proposals were submitted: two from Charlotte DOT, three from Mooresville and one each from Cornelius, Statesville, Troutman and Union County. The process to finalize the UPWP was reviewed, including the role of the UPWP Review Subcommittee. Mr. Cook stated that

he hoped to present recommendations for Section 5303 allocations at the March meeting. PL and STP-DA recommendations will likely not occur until April.

12. Comprehensive Transportation Plan

Presenter:

Robert Cook

Summary:

Mr. Cook provided information to the MPO via a Power Point presentation, the contents of which are incorporated into the minutes. The presentation's purpose was to update the MPO on the CTP because an update had not been provided since January 2014, and further, because staff expects to request the MPO to begin a public outreach effort for CTP adoption later this year. Mr. Cook explained what a CTP is and how it relates to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (TIP) and TIP. He explained the status of the CTP's preparation, and discussed possible public involvement techniques.

13. Upcoming Agenda Items

Mr. Cook stated that the most pressing February agenda item would be the presentation of BA and STP-DA project lists. He reminded the MPO that it will be critical to take action on a complete TIP project list in March.

Madam Chairwoman and Board Members

My congratulations to Chairwoman McAulay on her re-lection.

My Name is Rob Kidwell and I am a resident of Huntersville and also a Town Commissioner of Huntersville. My comments and concerns tonight are my own and not the full thoughts of the Huntersville Board of Commissioners as we have not had any in depth discussion on this topic. I needed to make that clear so you do not receive a letter from anyone from The Huntersville Town Board on my behalf.

Over the next few meetings, you will be discussing how to spend the Bonus allocation money if the HOT lane project happens. I personally would not like to see any type of Toll road implemented in our region; I just wanted to put that on the record. However, if we should have to deal with this project it is only fair, reasonable, and equitable that the \$150 million dollars be allocated to the stake holders whom are affected by this project on a flat dollar amount per mile of each town for them to vote on and use on road projects their boards see fit. This rounds out to roughly \$5.7 million dollars per mile.

I have heard the argument that using it for the HOT lane project is better for the people, but that is assuming everyone will use the Toll roads, whereas if the towns can use that money for Intersections, road improvements or traffic signals as each area sees fit no matter where they lie on the TIP list.

I do not believe that it should be used to better any ingress or egress points for any HOT lane or be taken by any single town or city.

I understand that there may be some who feel that this money should be used for the top projects inside the corridor, and it should not matter if you are affected by the project or not. I am in disagreement with you.

I also would like to say that to use it for anything associated with this potential project is nothing more than giving them money for something they should have worked out in the details prior to signing any contract.

I know that you have a heavy agenda ahead of you tonight, so I wanted to thank you for your time and consideration.
