The purpose of the report is to identify and track emerging trends that may influence the operation of the detention facilities. The data below captures activity during the fourth quarter of FY 2013 and compares the observations to those of the previous quarter and year.

- ADP decreased 3 percent (-36 inmates) from the same period of the previous year.
- Work Release ADP declined 49 percent from the previous year.
- ADP was 15 percent (335 inmates) below functional capacity during the fourth quarter.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Design capacity is the total beds available in the facilities. Functional capacity represents 85 percent of design capacity. Functional capacity is considered the maximum number that can be housed while still permitting the proper segregation and movement of inmates according to gender, security risk, and related factors. Work Release does not consider functional capacity in its operations.

- Gender and race characteristics within the jail population were unchanged compared to the previous quarter and same period last year. Males (89 percent) and African-Americans (69 percent) remain the dominant population groups.
- Pretrial inmates comprised 64 percent of the population; a decline of 3 percentage points from the previous year and unchanged from the previous quarter.
- Federal inmates, on average, represented 28 percent of the jail's population, an increase of 2 percentage points from the previous year.

• Average monthly intake volume for State inmates decreased 5 percent from the previous year.



<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Average length of stay is determined by averaging the reported ALOS for each group in the FY 2010 MCSO Detention Report. The Detention Report calculates ALOS as (Total Bed Days / Number of Jail Intakes). "Bed days" is calculated as the sum of the reported average daily population. An "intake" is defined as an individual receiving a housing assignment (those who bond out or are otherwise released prior to a housing assignment are not considered intakes).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> This table examines ALOS based on the release reason. Length of stay is calculated as the number of days between the commit date and release date as found in the OMS Release Report (OIRRELDT). Only those individuals assigned housing in the jail will be found on the OMS report.

### **V. Trends and Forecasting**



Observed and Forecast Average Daily Population

Given no changes within the criminal justice system, a seasonal peak ADP of 2,157 is projected in September, followed by a return to mid-year levels as the winter months approach.
