Comments	<ul> <li>Brock Fankhauser, Fankhouser Property Group, David Braun, Civil Engineer EMHT, and Brian Tuttle. Mr. Tuttle reported to the commission;</li> <li>Proposing to build approximately 90 Ranch-Style Condo units in the southwest corner of the Stonecrest Development.</li> <li>Developing Group has met with LWMC previously and discussed the Stormwater and Water Quality Management System. The storm water collection system exceeds DHEC standards.</li> <li>Out of the 24 acres, there will be approximately 10 acres of open space.</li> <li>Chairman Stowe asked if York County had a mandate on the amount of Open Space one must have. Brian Tuttle replied that York County requires 20% of Open Space. David Braun added that these condominiums are located in Tega Cay.</li> <li>Commissioner Cloninger showed concern regarding red mud runoff into the streams from this property. Brian Tuttle replied that the area is completely revegetated now and DHEC inspectors are pleased.</li> <li>Commissioner Cloninger also asked about the road that is a connector from Tega Cay to this Development. Brian Tuttle states that this is a high priority and they have agreed to get involved with it by virtue of the design of this connector. Environmental	<ul> <li>Mecklenburg County Parks and Recreation – Woody Woodward reported <ul> <li>Woody briefly discussed the County budget</li> <li>Two (2) staff members are at James Island, SC being certified in canoe/kayaking</li> <li>Woody has been very busy for the past three weekends attending Bass Tournaments for local clubs</li> <li>Peak season began March 1</li> <li>Campground has been filling up regularly with campers</li> <li>Future goals is to have sewer hook up eventually at the Nature Preserve</li> </ul> </li> <li>Discussion of the Agreement in Principle – Vice Chairman Montgomery reported that the Agreement in Principle currently provides for Lake Wylie the following benefits.</li> <li>Canoe/Kayak Trail - working on possibly creating steps on the backside of the dam. If not steps, there will be a trail that will go from the Hwy 9 Bridge to the dam. This will provide assess to parking and in-out boat areas. Duke Power is to set aside the land and York County will fund this project.</li> <li>Signing of the AIP – Commissioner Montgomery would like the Lake Wylie Marine Commission to sign the Agreement In Principle. This is not the final agreement but this document must be signed in order to negotiate any of its contents.</li> <li>As part of the signing, each signer is requested to rate how satisified he or she is with the agreement. The rating scale is as follows: If you sign as a (1-2) your happy with the AIP, (3-4) Fairly to Not Happy, (5-6) Not signing</li> <li>Commissioner Montgomery stated that he is very pleased with the AIP and feels that the commission should sign at a (2).</li> </ul>	A motion was made by Vice Chairman Montgomery that the LWMC should sign the AIP at a rate of 2. Seconded by Commissioner Ibach. The motion was approved.
Public Safety	<ul> <li>Discussion of the Law Enforcement Facility – Chairman Joe Stowe reported</li> <li>The lease is scheduled to be given to Chairman Stowe by Friday, March 31<sup>st</sup> or no later that Wed., April 5<sup>th</sup>.</li> </ul>	

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Finance	<ul> <li>Executive Director Mike McLaurin reported</li> <li>Mike met with the Officers of LWMC this morning at COG headquarters to discuss and review the Finance and Activity Report. This will become a regular meeting at 8:00 am on the morning of the scheduled LWMC business meeting.</li> <li>The new format for the finance report was distributed to the commissioners. It contains an income statement along with a balance sheet. Mike stated that if any of the commissioners would like to revise the format let him know. The activity report and new finance report will be sent to the commissioners prior to the business meetings for their review.</li> <li>2006-2007 Budget Spreadsheet – Mike suggests that each commissioner look over this budget and let him know of any questions or concerns. A public hearing will need to be scheduled for the spring.</li> <li>From a request from Commissioner Ibach during the February LWMC, Mike researched the options the commission has on investing their money and how to get a better yield. North Carolina Capital Management Trust was created for local governments in North Carolina. They currently offer a net yield of 4.75%. This is a type of money market account. Each commissioner was given informational documentation on NCCMT and what other counties and/or towns who participate.</li> </ul>	A motion was made by Commissioner Ibach to authorize Mike McLaurin to place LWMC funds into the North Carolina Capital Management Trust. Seconded by Commissioner DuPuy. The motion was approved.
