	The proposed ReVenture Park is a 667-acre Superfund Site along the Catawba River in Charlotte, NC. This park will feature multiple clean-energy facilities, laboratories and companies. The Eco-Industrial Park is designed to leverage synergies between sustainable components that include a Biomass power plant, solar fields, incubator labs, wastewater treatment and reuse, and R&D facilities. Estimated to generate over \$900 million of new

ReVenture Eco Industrial Park Project (continued)	investment, ReVenture Park could create more than 1,100 green collar jobs when fully developed. The ReVenture Team includes developers, engineers, project managers, environmental experts and civic leaders. Currently, the project is in the final stages of the Superfund de-listing process with the EPA and the terms of the Brownfield agreement are being negotiated with the NC Department of Environment Natural Resources. ReVenture Park is slated to be ready for development by early 2010.

The crossing location is within the FERC Project Boundary of Lake Wylie. The Town of Cramerton has received NC State funding for the development of a park designated as Goat Island Park. The Town has requested that Duke Energy provide electrical service to the island to facilitate construction of Phase 1 of the park and future amenities.</li> </ul>	A motion was made by Vice Chairman Everhart to approve the proposed underground cable crossing at the South Fork River in Gaston County project as presented. Update on Paradise Point Buoys	<ul> <li>• Follow up on buoys located at Riverfront Community (Gaston County) – Owners have been contacted to remove illegal buoys or to go through the proper channels to get them approved. Mr. Carey Ayres with Skipjack asked the Commission to comment on these buoys. Mr. Ayres stated that the existing buoys were placed at the direction of FERC in 1998 during the approval process of this project. Executive Director Joe Stowe replied that the Marine Commission would have also had to approve the installation of the buoys. The existing buoys are not official buoys and are not enforceable by law enforcement. The Commission informed Mr. Ayres that he needed to go through the proper channels to get the buoys officially approved through the Commission in order for them to stay in this area.
