	 Lakekeepers Report – Alice Battle was not present but provided her report to the Commission prior to the meeting Randy Miller reported on the status of the Stonewater violations. The silt bags and silt fences were installed within the 14 days notice of violation. Danon did not require the seeding of the berms behind Jeff Huggins home because it was the wrong time of the year to plant seeds. The Covekeepers elected to adopt the island at Duck Cove as part of the Island Habitat program. Alice Battle and Kathy Jaeck will be monitoring the prothonotary warber boxes that will be placed at this location. A map of Johnson Creek was distributed and discussed. It was compared to an actual topo map. The exchange to be built on the new Hwy 16 is on a relatively flat topography uphill of critical perennial streams of Johnson Creek. The topo map also showed the steep descent from that site to the stream beds. 	 MI Wildlife Stewards – Tim Eldridge and Pam Beck reported Fish attractors to be installed in Mountain Island Lake towards the end of March. 	
	Chairman Pam Beck voiced her concern that the attractors will be installed in shallow water and could become a safety hazard for swimmers. Commissioner Eldridge stated that the installation would be in at least 20' of water. Commissioner Dan DuVall added that these attractors are needed on Mountain Island Lake. Grass carp have taken

Reports (continued)	form of vegetation for other types of fish. Fish can ambush their prey with the help of	
	these devices and once algae start to grow on them; this could provide a form of	
	vegetation. Commissioner Eldridge asked for clarification on the environmental impact	
	from installing plastic PVC piping into the lake. PVC does not release any toxic	
	chemicals that would be harmful, stated DuVall.	
	Kermitt Taylor with Duke Energy informed the Commission that there are certain	
	regulations identifying the depth of water that the attractors should be installed. Also,	
	fish attractors can be placed under a permitted dock. This is a good location that would	
	prevent any safety hazards. Secretary Treasurer Danzi asked who enforces these	
	regulations. Legal Counsel Chris Clark stated that the enforcement of regulations	
	should not be discussed. The Mountain Island Lake Marine Commission is not an	
	enforcement body but a policy body. Danzi suggested that a policy be made through	
	the Marine Commission on how to properly place fish habitats. Several Commissioners	
	see that placing fish attractors into MI Lake as a non-issue. Chairman Pam Beck stated	
	that in the future, the Commission should be informed by NC Wildlife when such an	
	undertaking is happening on Mountain Island Lake.	
	As stated in the MILMC Statement of Purpose, one of the commission's obligations is	
	to protect and promote wildlife. Aquatic life is a part of this obligation, stated	
	Commissioner Eldridge.
