Their records are updated for deaths that occur after the initial report is filed. These numbers also include deaths where a medical condition (e.g., heart attack) may later be found to have caused the accident and/or the death involved in the accident. Fatality figures published in earlier reports may not include these two types of cases and are therefore not directly comparable.





Uniform Crime Reporting Procedures:

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department reports offense and arrest statistics in accordance with standard Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) guidelines. UCR policy states that any adjustments to previous months can be made on the current month's report:

...In tabulating crime counts, an agency may find that offense totals for past months require adjustments due to developments in the investigation or other handling of the matter. It may be necessary to adjust totals reported to UCR for the past month or prior months.

Needed adjustments can be made on the current month's report and do not affect the reliability of the figures in that such adjustments tend to equalize each other from month to month over a period of time.

We are required to report crime monthly to the UCR program, and we do therefore make an effort to process monthly changes in a timely manner. However, occasionally due to the review and processing required for reclassifying, unfounding or clearing cases, the current month's totals may reflect the processing of a backlog of these changes from previous months.

Users of the data are cautioned that conclusions about substantial changes in crime trends or in clearance rates based on only a single month's data or trend may reflect some of these adjustments. For this reason, in addition to the monthly and year-to-date trends on Page 1, the monthly report routinely includes a comparison for the previous 12 months (p. 4), as well as graphs that provide seasonal/monthly comparisons over a five year period (p. 5-8).

We do make an effort to present the most accurate information available at the time this report is published. However, errors in compiling the charts do sometimes occur, so please notify the Research, Planning, and Analysis office if you have any questions about the data in this report.
