Clearances for homicides from years prior to the automated KBCOPS Records and Case Management modules were counted in the December clearances.








Clearance rates for crime reporting are calculated by dividing the number of crimes cleared during a designated time span by the number of crimes reported in the same period and converting the result to a percentage (mutiplying by 100). Since cases from previous reporting periods can be cleared during the designated time span, the rate may be higher than 100%.




































### **Uniform Crime Reporting Procedures**

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department reports offense and arrest statistics in accordance with standard Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) guidelines. UCR policy states that any adjustments to previous months can be made on the current month's report:

...In tabulating crime counts, an agency may find that offense totals for past months require adjustments due to developments in the investigation or other handling of the matter. It may be necessary to adjust totals reported to UCR for the past month or prior months. Needed adjustments can be made on the current month's report and do not affect the reliability of the figures in that such adjustments tend to equalize each other from month to month over a period of time.

- Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, FBI, 1984, p. 42-43

We are required to report crime monthly to the UCR program, and we do therefore make an effort to process monthly changes in a timely manner. However, occasionally due to the review and processing required for reclassifying, unfounding or clearing cases, the current month's totals may reflect the processing of a backlog of these changes from previous months.

Users of the data are cautioned that conclusions about substantial changes in crime trends or in clearance rates based on only a single month's data or trend may reflect some of these adjustments. For this reason, in addition to the monthly and year-to-date trends on Page 1, the monthly report routinely includes a comparison for the previous 12 months (p. 4), as well as graphs that provide seasonal/monthly comparisons over a five-year period (p. 5-8).

#### **UCR Definitions and Terms:**

Index Crime: the eight offenses that the national UCR program tracks on a yearly basis to gauge trends in the extent of crime, despite differences among state and local criminal statutes. These offenses were selected on the basis of several factors: seriousness, frequency of occurrence, pervasiveness in all geographic areas, and/or likelihood of being reported to law enforcement.

Violent Index: includes the offenses of murder/non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault

Property Index: includes the offenses of burglary, larceny, vehicle theft and arson

Murder/non-negligent manslaughter: the willful killing of one human being by another

Rape: the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will [Note: This offense does <u>not</u> include other sex offenses or statutory (non-forcible) rape.]

Robbery: the taking or attempt to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force, threat of force or violence, or by putting the victim in fear.

Aggravated assault: an unlawful attack by one person on another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury; includes 1) all assaults in which a weapon of any type is used or is threatened to be used and/or 2) all assaults where serious injury occurs.

Burglary: the unlawful entry or attempted entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft

Larceny-Theft: the unlawful taking (or attempt), carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another [Note: Larceny/theft of a motor vehicle is classed separately.]

Vehicle Theft: the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle (a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land and not on rails, excluding farm and construction equipment)

Arson: the willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a structure, motor vehicle, personal property of another, etc.

Hierarchy rule: For cases involving multiple-offenses, the incident is classified and counted based on the highest offense on a hierarchy of crimes established by UCR. For example, for an incident involving a rape and a burglary, the incident would be counted in the rape category because rape is higher than burglary on the hierarchy.

Clearance: A case is considered cleared when either at least one arrest is made for the offense or when an offender's identity is established by investigation but the offender will not be arrested for reasons outside law enforcement control (offender dies, victim refuses to prosecute, district attorney declines prosecution, extradition is refused, etc.).

Unfounding: A case is "unfounded" and subtracted from the crime counts when investigation establishes that the incident did not actually occur or that the actions within the incident are not criminal based on current law.
