

Guiding PrinciplesBoard Policy JCA

- Home schools are first priority for student assignment and operational decisions
- Magnet schools offer opportunities outside home school assignment that combine three characteristics:
 - >Track record of consistently high student achievement
 - > Track record of narrowing achievement gaps at a rate that exceeds the aggregate rate of the home schools
 - Academically distinctive, demonstrably innovative, and/or more diverse than adjacent home schools
- Stability and predictability
- Diversity
- Effective use of capital resources
- Use of decision matrix
- Community involvement







The Way Forward

- **Goal 1:** Accelerate academic achievement for every child and close achievement gaps so every child graduates college- or career-ready.
- **Goal 2:** Ensure an effective teacher in every class is led by an effective principal in every school served by quality support staff.
- **Goal 3:** Cultivate innovative partnerships with parents, caregivers and the community to provide a sustainable system of support for every child.
- Goal 4: Nurture a culture of high engagement, customer service and cultural competency.
- Goal 5: Maximize performance utilizing data-informed and evidence-based decision-making.
- **Goal 6:** Strengthen and expand educational choices for students to drive learning, creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship.
- Goal 7: Increase technology access and integration to support inspired learning and teaching.
- **Goal 8:** Communicate proactively and transparently to strengthen public trust and establish CMS as the premier K-12 choice.





The Way Forward

- **Goal 6:** Strengthen and expand educational choices for students to drive learning, creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship.
 - Position neighborhood schools as schools of choice; help every school find its unique voice.
 - Promote new non-traditional educational options to support students with unique needs and circumstances, e.g., schools with onsite daycare, suspension-alternative schools.
 - Create new magnets, middle colleges, and Cooperative Innovative High Schools.
 - Strengthen, expand and align current Career and Technical Education offerings to ensure post-secondary preparation for students.
 - Support the success of Project L.I.F.T. and expand best-practice learning across the district.

New Educational Choices Which Require Capital Programming Support



Repurpose Starmount for Enrollment Relief

- Impact:
 - Repurpose Starmount as elementary relief to Huntingtowne Farms and Montclaire.
- Description:
 - Bond funding needed for upfit.
 - Boundary adjustments to be approved by Board of Education.
 - Relocate existing central-office staff.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.



Repurpose Oakhurst, STEAM Magnet and Enrollment Relief

■ Impact:

➤ Provide relief for K-8 STEM magnet; Morehead 1,000-student wait pool to meet demand for STEM magnet and infuse arts.

Description:

- Repurpose Oakhurst as a K-5 STEAM, full-magnet program (no home attendance zone.)
- Fill all grades in first year school opens.
- Students feed from the Green transportation zone (southeast region of district) to McClintock (grades six through eight STEAM) and to Smith Math and Science high school continuation.
- Existing central-office staff relocate to another site to be determined.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.



Recommission Oakhurst and Starmount Elementary Schools

Position 1

\$5,940,000

- Oakhurst to be converted into a Science Technology Engineering Arts Mathematics (STEAM) magnet and provide relief to adjacent elementary schools.
- Starmount will receive renovations and provide relief for Montclaire and Huntingtowne Farms.

Albemarle Road K-8 Dual Language Magnet and Enrollment Relief

■ *Impact:*

New K-8 school to provide relief to Albemarle Road Elementary and Albemarle Road Middle.

Description:

- Limited attendance boundary to provide relief to surrounding schools requiring Board of Education approval.
 - Athletics offered.
- Remaining seats for Dual Language Immersion (Spanish) magnet program serving the Green transportation zone and providing relief for Collinswood. (Blue transportation zone feed – southwest region of district.)
- Feed to East Mecklenburg High's new Language Immersion program.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.






Albemarle Road K-8 School

Position 4

\$29,376,000

- New 54-classroom K-8 to provide relief for Albemarle Road ES/MS
- Dual Language Immersion will provide relief for Collinswood K-8







CPCC Middle College

- Impact:
 - > Expand the Middle College offerings to CMS juniors and seniors.
- Description:
 - ➤ Middle College program on selected CPCC campuses.
 - Serve approximately 200 students.


2013-14 – Implementation

Middle college program on the CPCC Levine campus. Serve approximately 200 students in modular units.

2014-15 – Explore

- Hendrick Motorsports near CPCC campus is authorized trainer for Lexus and BMW. Marancas campus of CPCC has fabrication lab for motorsports.
- Possibility of a motorsports themed high school at Vance, Butler or North Mecklenburg. Vance currently has an Academy of Engineering.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.






Classroom Building On CPCC Campus

Davidson K-8 Enrollment Relief

- Impact:
 - Addition to existing facility at Davidson Elementary to house grades sixth through eight to provide relief to Bailey Middle.
- Description:
 - Attendance boundary for elementary serves as middle school grades requiring Board of Education approval.
 - Athletics offered.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent County funding authorization.





Davidson K-8 Conversion

Position 14 \$7,560,000

New general and specialty classrooms.





South K-8 STEAM and Enrollment Relief

Impact:

New K-8 school to provide relief to Community House and JM Robinson middle schools and Ballantyne, Hawk Ridge, Polo Ridge and Elon Park elementary schools.

Description:

- Limited attendance boundary to provide relief to surrounding schools requiring Board of Education approval.
- Remaining seats for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) magnet program serving the Blue transportation zone and providing relief to Morehead STEM.
- High school students may continue to Smith Academy for Math and Science.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.





New K-8 School

Position 15

\$29,376,000

- New 54-classroom K-8 school
- Provides relief for Ballantyne, Elon Park, Hawk Ridge, and Polo Ridge elementary schools, and Community House and J.M. Robinson middle schools







Smith Academy for Math and Science HS


■ Impact:

Expand educational choices for secondary Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs.

Description:

- ➤ Build new facility to house full magnet math and science high school on the current Smith property at 1600 Tyvola Road.
- No athletics offered; students may play at home school.
- Fill all grades first school year open except for senior class.
- Students feed from the south half of county.
- Existing central office staff at Smith Family Center will move to another site.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.





New Math and Science Magnet High School

Position 19

\$43,200,000

- Construction of a new 1,500 seat Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (STEM) magnet high school
- To be built on the current Smith Family Center site





E.E. Waddell Language Academy K-12

Impact:

Expand Language Immersion through grade 12. Provide continuum and ability to consolidate high school language program to fulfill commitment to Language Immersion through graduation.

Description:

- Language Academy magnet program students stay at E.E. Waddell starting with the ninth grade.
- Language programs at West Mecklenburg and South Mecklenburg will potentially phase out.
- Feed for county-wide high school languages program, not including Spanish Immersion for Green transportation zone (to East Mecklenburg) and Violet/Grey transportation zone. (to North Mecklenburg)
- Add 25 classrooms to accommodate 625 students. The school has 71 classrooms.
- No athletics offered at high school. Students may play at home school.



E.E. Waddell 9-12 Classroom Addition

Position 22

\$7,560,000

25-classroom addition will allow this school to expand to a K-12 Language
 Academy







Mountain Island Elementary Transition to K-8

Position 42

- Impact:
 - > To allow students to continue STEM focus through grade eight.
- Description:
 - Add K-8 program to Mountain Island, growing a grade each year starting with sixth grade (will maintain school-wide STEM focus).
 - ✓ No athletics at Mountain Island K-8; may participate at Coulwood.
 - ✓ Will result in smaller enrollment at Coulwood.
 - ✓ Use mobile units for grades expansion in grades six eight.

2014-15 Explore

 Engage Coulwood community in various program and grade-level configurations, including options for magnet focus and levels six – eight or K-8.

Project contingent on future voter-approved bonds and subsequent county funding authorization.

Position 2

\$8,964,000

- Construction of a 20-classroom addition.
- Comprehensive renovation of auditorium.
- Improve facility condition and add capacity.







J.M. Alexander Middle School Replacement

Position 3

\$30,672,000

- New replacement school similar to Whitewater and Ridge Road middle schools.
- Existing facility beyond economical repair.







- Improve facility condition.

Position 7

\$29,376,000

- New 54-classroom Pre K-8.
- Provide relief for Berryhill and Reid Park.









Nations Ford Elementary Replacement School

Position 8

\$19,440,000

- New 39-classroom replacement elementary school near E.E. Waddell Academy campus.
- Existing site for future Collinswood replacement.
- Facility beyond economical repair.










Myers Park High School Addition/Renovation

Position 9

\$22,248,000

- Add 50-classroom multi-story building.
- Renovations to kitchen/cafeteria.
- Demolition of buildings that house chemistry, biology, and information technology.
- Increase capacity and replace buildings beyond economical repair.





East Mecklenburg High School Addition/Renovation

Position 10 \$12,744,000

- Add 30-classroom building.
- Renovations to selected areas including locker rooms.
- Increase capacity and replace building beyond economical repair.





Pre K-8 Additions/Renovations

Position 11

\$24,732,000

Complete Conversions of Pre-K-8 Schools

- Bring schools up to Pre K-8 standards.
- Ashley Park Pre K-8 (gymnasium; exploratory and arts classrooms; technology classrooms)
- Bruns Avenue Pre K-8 (kitchen and cafeteria upgrades; exploratory and arts classrooms)
- Walter G. Byers Pre K-8 (exploratory and arts classrooms; technology classrooms)
- Druid Hills Pre K-8 (gymnasium; exploratory and arts classrooms)
- Reid Park Pre K-8 (gymnasium; exploratory and arts classrooms; dining expansion)
- Westerly Hills Pre K-8 (gymnasium; exploratory and arts classrooms; technology classrooms)






Statesville Road Elementary Replacement School



- Improve condition of existing facility and removal of buildings beyond economical repair.







- (1) Myers Park IB for Myers Park HS attendance boundary only
- (2) Irwin TD guarantee to Piedmont; Barringer TD guarantee to Randolph; guarantee based on student's transportation zone
- (3) Students from the home high school boundaries of Ardrey Kell, Harding, Hopewell, Myers Park*, Olympic Community of Schools, South Meck, West Charlotte and West Meck will receive transportation to Myers Park Traditional. Students from the home high school boundaries of Butler, Hough, East Meck, Garinger, Independence, Mallard Creek, Rocky River, Myers Park*, North Meck, Providence and Vance will receive transportation to Elizabeth Traditional. *Students in the Myers Park High School attendance area may apply to either Elizabeth Traditional or Myers Park Traditional.
- (4) Students must apply to Alexander (except Blythe IB and Violet transportation zone TD students in Mallard Creek LI/TD)
- (5) Harding county-wide; must apply. Harding is the IB high school for students whose home school is Olympic or Harding. Students living in the Harding attendance boundary receive neighborhood transportation.
- (6) East Mecklenburg is the IB high school for students whose home high school is Ardrey Kell or South Mecklenburg
- (7) Piedmont and Randolph half county-wide; must apply (except Irwin TD to Piedmont, Barringer TD to Randolph, Cotswold Blue zone residents, & Huntingtowne Farms Blue zone residents)
- (8) Mallard Creek serves the Violet transportation zone and the Mallard Creek High School attendance boundary
- (9) Magnet shuttle bus transportation service. Magnet student pick-up and drop-off locations and times at identified CMS sites will be designated by CMS Transportation for students attending these schools.
