



# Continuous Improvement Update Report to Board of Education

December 13, 2011

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## Introduction

Nearly two years ago, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education undertook a comprehensive review of Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools. This review included many community meetings, Board work sessions and Board discussions over the course of almost six months in the summer and fall of 2010.

During this process, the Board established guiding principles to help it make decisions. The Board identified academic achievement as its main goal.

Other guiding principles included giving first priority to home schools; setting high expectations for magnet schools, such as stronger achievement, diversity and distinct programs; student assignment that promoted stability and predictability; school assignments that represented the demographics of feeder school areas; effective use of buildings and buses, and promoting community involvement.

The decisions that followed were hard decisions made in hard times. We had had to cut millions from our budget, and in the fall of 2010, we expected to have to cut millions more. We could have made the necessary cuts and resigned ourselves to doing less with less – or we could have viewed the economic hardship as an opportunity to make some innovative changes along with saving money.

We chose the latter path, taking advantage of the opportunity to make changes that were innovative as well as cost-effective. The Board voted to close 11 schools and make changes at 42 others -- changes to improve academic achievement and reflect Board priorities of strong neighborhood schools and stable student assignment, as well as effective use of buildings and buses.

The Board decisions fell into three broad categories: closing schools, consolidating schools/boundary changes and changing programs. Nearly all of the changes took effect at the start of this school year. We're nearly halfway through the year now and we've had some questions from new Board members and others about what impact and effect the changes have had. Tonight, we're going to give you a status report, a summary of where we are now with these changes. Some of the questions that have been asked can't be answered yet. Some have incomplete answers. But we're going to give you the most complete picture that we can, using the data we have now, of how CMS has put into place the school changes voted on by the Board in the fall of 2010.

There's a lot of information in this report, and you will receive it in three forms: I will summarize it for you and then Scott McCully will provide more details in a powerpoint presentation. Scott's presentation is based on the data we have provided to you that has the most detailed, comprehensive information in it – the charts, tables and other statistical information compiled by staff that support tonight's report.

In looking at the changes made this year, and their impact, and in trying to answer the questions from Board members, we divided the information into broad categories that we felt represented the most comprehensive way to assess our schools. You could call them the big buckets. They are aligned with the guiding principles established last year.

First, there is academic achievement. That remains the top CMS goal, and we'll address that first. We'll tell you about the programs and supports we've provided the 42 schools affected by the changes as well as other measures of academic achievement such as staffing and student behavior.

Second is strengthening home schools and ensuring that magnet schools show stronger achievement, diversity and distinct programs, and school assignments that are stable and represent the demographics of the school's feeder areas.

Third is the effectiveness piece. Did these changes do what we expected them to do? Did they have unintended consequences for students, staff, our schools and the larger community? Have our students been adversely affected by these changes?

I'm going to give you an overview of each of these parts, and then I'll hand it over to Scott to give you some highlights from the data package we've given you.

## **Academic achievement**

First is academic achievement.

This is the most important bucket, and it's the one with the least data available right now. We will have data when the first semester ends, after the first of the year, but we don't have it yet. Our grading is based on 18-week classes, or semesters. Some preliminary grading is done each quarter for the academic work done in that period. But the state tests cover the entire period, and we think that's the best way to accurately assess what our students have learned. Quarter grades can miss some academic scores, and not accurately reflect adjustments that individual teachers or schools are making to be sure each student learns.

So we can't answer the question posed by one Board member that asked us to compare how many students at the 42 schools affected by closings, consolidation or new programs are failing and succeeding, compared to a year ago. We can do a limited comparison at the end of the semester for our high schools and in some middle-school courses, but the real answer will come at the end of the school year.

Student grades and scores are one important measure of how a school is performing. But there are others and we've looked at those, too.

School staffing – our teachers, their performance and how long they stay with us – is one measure. So we looked at the 42 affected schools to see if we had unusually high turnover. We did not. Among the 42 schools, we presently have 32.5 positions that are vacant with no candidate in the pipeline. In 12.5 of the vacancies – and the point-five arises because schools sometimes share positions, and that was the case here – the job was open because of resignations. In the remaining 20, the vacancies had been created by promotions or increased enrollment that created a need for more teachers. These numbers encompass the start of this school year to the present.

One school – Morgan – has five vacancies because of resignations, promotions and increased allotments. Whitewater Middle has four vacancies because of retirement and increased allotments. Two schools have three vacancies – Harding and West Charlotte – created by resignations and increased allotments. No school among the 42 has more than five vacancies. Most of them have one or none. The 32.5 vacancies are one percent of the 2,470 teacher-level allocations at these 42 schools.

To give you some context: That matches the district-wide vacancy rate. As of Dec. 9, CMS had a total of 105 vacancies for which we don't have a candidate in the pipeline – or one percent of our total teacher-level allocation positions of 9,358. The numbers show that we haven't seen wholesale teacher turnover as a result of these changes, and that's good.

That said, we are also sensitive to the fact that if you're a parent, and your child is in one of those one-percent classrooms, that looks like a pretty big number to you! We are working to fill our vacancies as quickly as we can.

One Board member inquired about exit interviews. We have very limited data on that because exit interviews are optional. Every employee's exit packet includes an exit questionnaire and employees can request an exit interview. Most don't; less than one percent of the employees who returned the questionnaires asked for an exit interview.

Another way to look at academic achievement is to consider the school environment and whether there is a lot of disruption. To measure that, we used the numbers for student suspensions.

What we saw was that suspensions increased at some schools. They increased most at Harding, where the total number of suspensions from the start of school through Dec. 1 was 151 last year and 967 this year. That's a big increase. In his presentation, Scott will show you a chart that will provide some context for that data.

There was also a question about 504 plans for students. These are plans to accommodate students who may have special learning needs but do not qualify as EC students – they may need extra time on tests or to take a different version of a test. We have included statistical information on those students in your packet. Some general context on that to keep in mind: CMS was a pioneer in recordkeeping in this area for the whole state. We saw a way to keep the

data in NCWISE so that teachers and school staff would have real-time access to it – and now the state is using us as a model for its new plan.

## **Strengthening schools**

Now I'm going to talk about the second bucket: strengthening home schools and magnets, and having stability in school assignments.

The most important measure of how well we have strengthened home schools and magnets is academic performance – and as I mentioned earlier, we don't have a lot of academic data yet. But we looked at some other measures that could help assess this, too.

One area is student transfers. At the 42 schools this year, 140 students returned to their home schools between July 1 and December 1 of this year. Last year, for the same period, 114 students returned to their home schools after the first day of school. Thirty-three students opted to enter a different CMS program after the start of school this year. Last year, the number was 63 for these. Between July 1 and Dec. 1 of this year, 267 students from the 42 schools left CMS after the first day of school for charter schools or home schooling, compared to 168 for the same period a year ago. We typically compare one year to another, using data for an entire year. So we don't have district-wide data yet.

To understand the changes that we have made, another relevant area is demographic information. Economically disadvantaged students were 63.8 percent of Harding's enrollment in 2010-2011; this year, it was 79.4 percent. At Winding Springs, it was 72.1 percent last year and 87.0 percent this year. Those were the two schools that saw the largest increase in the economically disadvantaged population.

The largest increase in students with limited English proficiency occurred at Harding, which went from none in 2010-2011 to eight percent this year. For exceptional children, Harding also had the largest increase, moving from 20 EC students last year to 201 this year. The next largest change occurred at Reid Park, which went from 50 EC students to 123, and South Meck, which went from 146 EC students last year to 206 this year. We also have a total of 830 students in these schools with 504 plans, and 3,038 students with IEP plans.

Another important demographic measure is level of poverty. When a school has 75 percent of its students or more in poverty, it is eligible for Title I funds. Among our 42 schools this year, 21 are currently Title I schools. Last year, including the 11 schools that closed, the number was 25. This year, three schools became Title I: West Charlotte, West Meck and Harding.

Finally, grant funding can strengthen a school. All of the 42 schools affected by closure and consolidation benefit from grant money. We have provided you with a spreadsheet showing how each school benefits from grants and what those grants are.

## Effectiveness

How effectively did we make these changes and transitions? The answer obviously varies by school. But overall, I believe that we have been largely successful in making these changes while keeping student learning on track at these 42 schools. Each school devised its own transition plan, under the watchful supervision of Ann Clark and her team. Staff at these schools spent much of the summer meeting, planning and putting their plans to work.

A partial list of what was done at the schools: Working together to make sure incoming students from another school were welcomed and prepared. Hiring staff and coaches into the receiving schools to ease student transitions. Specialized training where needed when a school's population was changing in some way. Each school receiving new students held a student orientation, and some schools delayed student-government elections so that the incoming students could participate. We also worked to make sure that students at our pre-K-8 schools had extracurricular and sports opportunities. We've included a chart showing sports data in your packet. School clubs are open to all students.

Pre-K-8 schools are gaining favor in some parts of the country, and our review of the literature as well as data we looked at suggested it could work here, too. Eliminating the transition from elementary to middle school has been shown to improve student achievement at some schools and we're hearing very good feedback from our principals and teachers about the Pre-K-8s. It may take a year or two before we begin to see the real benefits of these schools but I believe they will be significant, based on what we're already hearing from our principals and teachers.

Students and families at the 42 schools have access to the same support structures as the rest of the district. These include Parent University, partnerships at individual schools and CMS support such as tutoring, mentoring and other services. Many of the 42 schools also get extra support through the grants we discussed earlier and through Title I.

One Board member requested data about the number of times I have visited schools, as well as the number for zone superintendents. I can tell you the data for me: Since the school year began, I have visited 24 of the 42 schools, or slightly more than half. In all, I have visited 40 schools this year.

We don't keep data on zone superintendents' visits to schools. They visit *all* of their schools regularly because of specific needs, scheduled meetings or other events. We do not track how often Board members visit schools. Nor do we keep data on parent meetings at individual schools, so I can't provide that.

Now I'll turn to the renovations and building aspects of these changes. All of the costs associated with these changes came from the 2010-2011 budget – last year's budget. We spent

\$4.2 million on capital improvements, including \$968,569 to move mobile classrooms to the affected schools. That is all we expect to spend by the end of the current fiscal year.

On the leasing of unused facilities: We have executed contracts for five sites, and tonight we brought you leases for two more, Plaza Road and Pawtucket. The remaining sites are in various stages of negotiation and we have given you a chart showing the status of each one. The leases make the tenants solely responsible for the costs of maintaining and operating, and we have provided details to the tenants about our expectations for maintenance. The lease terms vary by location but most are five-year leases.

Thus far, we have negotiated a total of \$116,594 for the first year's rents for these facilities. The Board indicated that the top priority should be making the facilities available to educational programs or other programs that serve our students. We have followed that guidance. A bit of context here: If we were operating and maintaining these facilities, it would cost us close to a million dollars a year – so we've avoided those costs, which enabled us to use that money elsewhere.

We have not encountered any obstacles to leasing these buildings. The negotiations are often slower than is typical because many of the tenants, which are often community organizations, do not have attorneys on staff.

We have provided you with a list of the facilities that we repurposed for our use and that is in your packet.

That's the overview. Now I'm going to turn it over to Scott, who will give you additional details.

*[Scott McCully's presentation]*

Thank you, Scott. Board members, if you feel as if you're drowning in data, it's understandable. These changes were both complex and far-reaching. To measure their impact requires looking at a lot of data.

The changes affected many of our schools and students, as well as the wider community. In some cases, they divided our community along racial and economic lines. The federal Office of Civil Rights has not concluded its investigation into complaints filed by citizens last year. Thus far, no findings have been released and no corrective actions have been issued for us. But it is a measure of how painful the budget cuts and these changes were for some members of the community.

The biggest question of all, and the most important one, is: Did we do the right thing? Did we make choices that helped our students and strengthened our schools? The short answer is, we don't know yet. It's been less than a semester since we began these changes – not enough time to make a definitive assessment. We need to see the academic achievement measures before



we can know for sure. But we have shared some preliminary indicators with you tonight. Many are positive. Some are not.

It's also early for us to draw a lot of conclusions on the operations side. I think we have learned that we need to look at a wider range of data when we redraw school boundaries – it would have helped us to plan better had we reviewed the discipline data, for example. The early indications for Pre-K-8 schools are very positive, particularly as you heard from our principals, at the school level. That's encouraging, because middle school is a key battleground in our efforts to keep kids in school all the way to graduation.

In looking back over the past year, as we have made these changes, I came across something one of our community members said that was very wise. Malachi Greene, a former City Council member and a community activist, understood the challenges we faced last year in remaining innovative and strong despite severe budget cuts for the past four years.

Mr. Greene said then, "'It's another one of those community problems that we've got to roll up our sleeves and do the Charlotte way: Work it out without tearing Charlotte apart. We've got to get through this without hurting what we all love, and that's our children and our community."

I think we have done that. We have not done it perfectly. We have not done it even as well as we would have liked. And we need more academic data before any final assessment can be reached. But here's what we know now: We have survived four years of budget cuts and made significant and far-reaching innovations in our schools. I think our district and our community are stronger as a result.

  - Entitlement/formula funding under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act
  - Grants from Wells Fargo and Belk Foundation to expand CMS Parent University program and operational support

## Facility Use

1. Relative to the school closures, consolidations, and program changes support was provided through the Office of Accountability's Center for Research and Evaluation. Literature reviews and data were gathered and disseminated. Eliminating transitions, especially at the middle years, is widely regarded as a promoting student achievement.
2. The total amount expended **from 2010-2011** funds was \$4,160,913 on capital improvements. \$968,569 was spent on relocating portables to the impacted schools, also from last year's budget. This is both the total-to-date and anticipated spend by the end of the current year.

3. The leases make the tenant solely responsible for the cost to maintain and operate the facility. Details regarding maintenance expectations have been provided. There is language for termination for cause as well as convenience in each lease; this language varies by tenant and facility. Most leases are for 5 years.
4. Maximizing income was not the guidance provided from CMBE to staff. Making the facilities available to educational programs, or those that serve our students, were among the top criteria weighted for staff's use.

5. There have been no obstacles, per se. Many of these community organizations do not have attorneys on staff, which slows the time for turn-around of the documents.

6. The facilities that we are repurposing are as follows:

The **Family Application Center, Magnet Office, ASEP, Bright Beginnings, International Center, Exceptional Children, Pre-K-12 Support Services, Talent Development, Advanced Studies,** and **Family Support** relocate to the former **Smith Middle School**

- Eliminates leased space at former Northeast Learning Community office
- Creates a centrally located, “one-stop shop” for parents
- Places **Family Application** on a bus line and near light rail

The **Professional Development Center** and **Human Resources** relocates to the former **Bishop Spaugh Community Academy Middle School**

- Eliminates lease of Cityview and former North Learning Community office
- Creates a self-contained environment for employee intake and development
- Utilizes sole auditorium space among available facilities

The **Central Zone** office and **Federal and State Compliance** relocate to the former **Villa Heights Elementary School**

- Eliminates need for leased space at Hal Marshall Annex
- Keeps Zone office within the Zone

The **Southwest Zone** office and **Transportation** relocate to the former **Starmount Pre-K Center**

- Eliminates lease of Cross Beam Drive for Southwest Zone office
- Eliminates lease of Airport Center building M for transportation
- Places Southwest Zone office on a bus line and better positioned geographically

**Media Services,** and the balance of **IT** relocate to the former **Freedom Regional Library at Phillip O. Berry High School**

- Eliminates lease of Airport Center building F for IT

The **East Zone** office and the balance of all administrative functions formerly housed at the **Education Center (Accountability, Budget and Finance, NCWise, and Student Applications and Development)** relocate to the former **Oakhurst Elementary School**

- Eliminates lease of Windsor Square for East Zone office
- Consolidates all remaining administrative functions in a single location
- Establishes a campus presence for future expansion
- Additionally, Child Nutrition has established a test kitchen and training center at Oakhurst

Also, John Taylor Williams has already been reprogrammed as the home of Right Choices, an alternative school program.
