The Blue Line Extension (Northeast Corridor) is an extension of the successful LYNX Blue Line light rail service. The 9.3-mile alignment extends from Ninth Street in Center City through the North Davidson (NoDa) and University areas, terminating on the UNC Charlotte campus.

Light Rail Travel Miles:

Travel Time:

25 minutes from Charlotte Transportation Center to UNC Charlotte 47 minutes total for cross-county travel (I-485 @ South Blvd to UNC Charlotte)

Projected Reduction in Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT):

119,000 fewer daily vehicle miles traveled in the Northeast Corridor 0.2 % reduction in daily vehicle miles traveled for the region

UNC Charlotte:

The largest university in the Charlotte region with more than 25,000 students enrolled at the 1,000-acre campus located in the university area. UNC Charlotte recently opened a Center City Campus in 2011 adjacent to the future LYNX Blue Line 9th Street Station offering graduate and continuing education courses.

The LYNX Blue Line will have a light rail station on campus easily accessible to the center of the campus and the future home of the 49er football stadium.

CMC University:

- 130 beds
- More than 8,700 surgical procedures are performed at CMC University hospital annually
- The second busiest Emergency Department in Mecklenburg County with over 65,000 patient visits per year

Economic Development:

There is a significant amount of land throughout the BLE corridor that is available for development and redevelopment. Once sites are rezoned, the new development will be required to be developed in a transit-friendly form.

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By 2035, the 11 light rail stations are projected to have:

- Over 10,000 new housing units
- Over 3.8 million square feet of new office
- Over 1.3 million square feet of new retail

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
