I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 4:00 p.m.

II. Approval of January 26, 2011 meeting summary

The meeting summary was approved as written.

III. Information Items

Dee Pereira gave a presentation on proposed financing options for the Red Line recommended by Jeff Parker & Associates (JPA) as follows:

Option 1 is a traditional publicly funded method for Capital Costs of 25% from CATS, 25% from NCDOT, with the remaining 50% unfunded; and Operations & Maintenance Costs of 25% from CATS with the remaining 75% unfunded.

JPA's recommendation is Option 2, a combination of public and private funding (P3). In this case, there would be a non-CATS public owner, e.g. NCDOT. This P3 case assumes that all of concessionaire's debt would be in a RRIF loan. Repayment to concessionaire of Capital Costs would be 25% from CATS, 25% from NCDOT, with the remaining 50% from yet to be determined funding sources. CATS could participate in up to 25% of the O&M Costs,

For both options, Ms. Pereira recommended discussion topics for the Red Line Task Force which included identifying the lead agency, identification of funding partners, commitments from funding partners, completion of financial agreements, project delivery method, etc. She suggested that a key first step in the process is to meet with NCDOT to determine their interest in leading this project. NCDOT has expressed interest in acting as load on the project and the Red Line Task Force needs to actively pursue this option for advancing the project. If either NCDOT or Norfolk Southern Railroad were to be the lead concessionaire, either of the agencies could qualify for a 35-year RRIF loan for construction of the project. CATS would support the State by utilizing some of Jeffrey Parker & Associates time toward financial planning.

Discussion

Carolyn Flowers indicated that John Collett had arranged for Secretary Conti, Deputy Secretary Westmoreland and Miriam Perry to meet with CATS on March 8, 2011 to discuss the path forward on the North Line which would include meetings with the MTC members representing the Northern towns.

John Muth stated the various State DOT's and the freight railroads are having on-going meetings in Washington to redefine the relationships between the States and the railroads, and to determine how high speed rail money will be allocated.

Carroll Gray noted that MTC must approve the funding method, and Ms. Flowers stated that the public/private partnership concept was approved at the November 2010 MTC meeting. He also asked when the line would be operational. Ms. Pereira stated the projected operation date is 2018.

Carolyn Flowers said due to State budget constraints, the possibility exists that transit funding could be eliminated so efforts must be made to keep transit in front of legislators. Paul Morris discussed the need to educate the newly elected legislators about state funds that are available for transit. Ms. Flowers and Mayor Woods have met and discussed legislators to approach who are not pro-transit or are uncertain about transit.

Brian Nadolny presented a draft of a financial work plan listing funding opportunities and possible partners. He discussed the various partners and the roles they might play. (Attachment 1). He also presented a document listing issues to be resolved. (Attachment 2). Leads for each of the partners/issues need to be assigned. Paul Morris stated the various partnerships created should operate within silos, and all conversations must be coordinated between CATS and Greenleaf Strategies. Paul Morris suggested that he, CATS and the City meet to determine which of the proposed partners are financial partners, is financing the primary component of the relationship, how to proceed most effectively to build relationships, and who should be the lead. Ms. Pereira, Ms. Flowers and Mr. Muth are leading the discussions with NCDOT and North Carolina. Jeff Parker will be asked to give his public/private partnership presentation to the Task Force and the MTC.

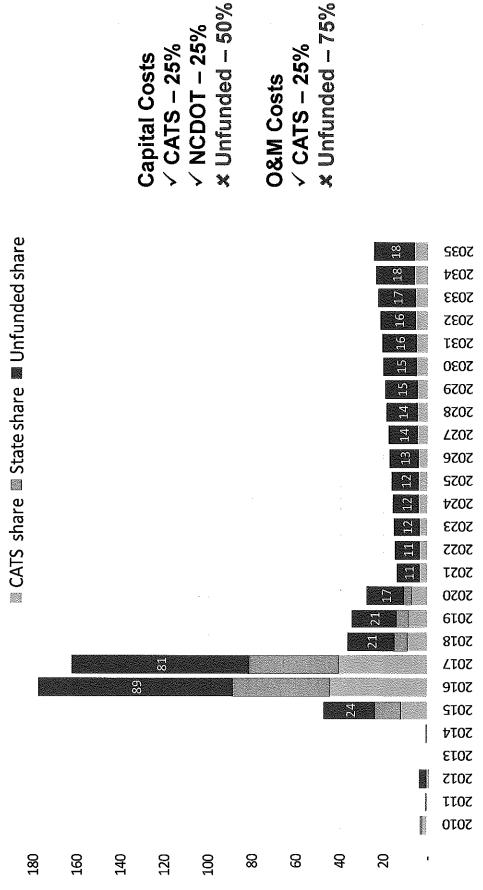

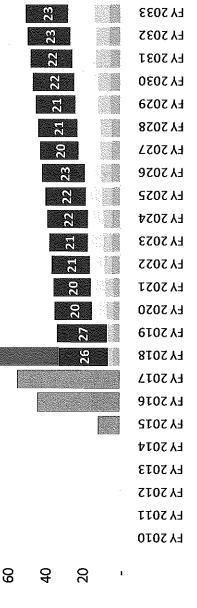
